The Girl Guides movement was founded in **1910** by **Agnes Baden-Powell** together with **Robert Baden-Powell**, the founder of the Scouting movement. While Scouting welcomed both boys and girls in many countries, Girl Guides developed as a dedicated space where girls could grow in confidence, leadership, independence, and practical life skills.

Today, the movement forms part of the **World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS)**, one of the world's largest organizations for girls and young women. Operating in more than **150 countries**, it continues to empower millions of girls to become responsible, compassionate, and impactful global citizens.

Building Strong Girls for a Stronger Future

The Girl Guides programme is carefully designed for different age groups, allowing every child to learn, grow, and thrive at an appropriate pace.

The various sections include:

- **Teddies:** Ages 4½–7
- **Brownies:** Ages 7–10
- **Guides:** Ages 10–14
- **Rangers:** Ages 14–18
- **Young Leaders / Trefoil Guild:** Ages 18–30 and adult women

Rather than focusing only on outdoor activities, Girl Guides equips young girls with practical skills they will carry throughout life.

Their adventure programmes include:

- **Safety Adventure** – First aid, emergency response, personal safety, and home safety.
- **Eco Green Adventure** – Environmental conservation, nature studies, tracking, and sustainability.
- **Inspirations Adventure** – Arts, crafts, creativity, innovation, and technology.
- **All About Me** – Personal hygiene, physical fitness, nutrition, confidence, and emotional well-being.

These programmes develop capable young women who are prepared to lead, serve, and care for others.

A Call to the Community

One message resonated throughout the day:

More Guide leaders are urgently needed.

In a world where many families face increasing social challenges—including bullying, neglect, violence, and the heartbreaking disappearance of children—the need for caring mentors has never been greater.

Organisers appealed to parents, community members, and volunteers to become involved in the movement and help expand its reach throughout Hammanskraal so that more girls can benefit from guidance, protection, and positive role models.

Every additional leader represents another child who receives encouragement, support, and hope.

Young Talent on Display

The celebration also highlighted the remarkable creativity of learners at **Lehwelereng Secondary School**.

Mrs. Mabaso proudly showcased a collection of beautifully handcrafted bags designed and produced by learners. Each piece reflected creativity, skill, and entrepreneurial spirit, demonstrating the incredible talent that exists within Hammanskraal's youth.

Members of the public interested in supporting these young designers were encouraged to purchase the handcrafted bags through Mrs. Mabaso.

TWO MEN APPEAR IN COURT FOR ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AND ATTEMPTED MURDER OF A SECURITY OFFICER

The National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) confirms the brief appearance of Jabulani Mthombeni (47) and Billy Tshepiso Malope (52) in the Pretoria Magistrates' Court. The pair face charges of attempted murder, attempted robbery with aggravating circumstances, and possession of ammunition. It is alleged that on 07 July 2026, a security officer was collecting cash from a gambling establishment in Silverton.

As he was walking towards a company vehicle in the parking area carrying the money, the accused allegedly opened fire on him in an apparent robbery attempt. During the exchange of gunfire, the security officer managed to run back to the cash office with the money. The suspects fled the scene before police arrived. The injured security officer was transported to the hospital for medical treatment. Following reports of the shooting, members of the South African Police Service (SAPS) launched an investigation and traced the suspects to Nellmapius.

Upon arrival at Malope's residence, police searched, located him, and placed him under arrest. During the operation, Mthombeni was found hiding at a nearby residence, a few houses away and was also arrested.

The matter was postponed to 13 July 2026 for bail investigations.

The NPA remains committed to working with law enforcement agencies to ensure that perpetrators of violent crimes are brought before the courts and held accountable.

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POLICE OPEN TWO INQUEST DOCKETS AFTER MAN AND 4-YEAR-OLD NEPHEW DIE AFTER CONSUMING BISCUITS

Mpumalanga police, have opened two inquest dockets after a 43-year-old man and his 4-year-old nephew died allegedly after consuming biscuits taken from a local spaza Shop.

Police spokesperson Colonel Mavela Masondo said, both of them started feeling dizzy and vomiting.

They were taken to a local medical facility where they were both certified dead on arrival.

The source of the biscuits and the cause of death will be determined through post-mortem examinations. Police urge members of the community not to consume foodstuffs obtained during looting, as their safety cannot be guaranteed.

A 36 YEAR OLD MAN ARRESTED FOR POSSESSION OF UNLICENSED FIREARM

A 36- year old foreign national has been arrested by Mpumalanga multidisciplinary team. At the time of arresy police were patrolling around the area when they spotted a suspicious Mitsubishi Colt bakkie.

Police spokesperson Lieutenant Colonel Jabu Ndubane, said the second suspect fled the scene upon seeing the police, and police went in and searched his room. Two black bulletproof vests were found, together with two pellet guns, and they were seized.

The firearm will be sent for ballistic tests, to determine if it was not used for other commission of crimes. The suspect is expected to appear at Magistrate's Court soon.

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STATE CALLS FIRST WITNESS IN ALLEGED ATTEMPTED MURDER TRIAL OF JOE SIBANYONI

The State today called its first witness, Bethwell Cele, in the trial of Vusimuzi "Cat" Matlala and his co-accused, Tsakani Matlala, Musa Kekana, Tiego Floyd Mabusela, and Zandile Nthabiseng Nzama, before the Gauteng Division of the High Court in Johannesburg.

Cele, a security guard who was on duty at the residential complex where the alleged attempted murder of Joe Sibanyoni took place, testified about the events surrounding the incident.

During the proceedings, the State sought to present video footage of the alleged incident as evidence. The defence objected to the admission of the footage, arguing that it could prejudice the accused and should first be authenticated by an expert witness through a trial-within-a-trial.

The court upheld the objection and ruled that the admissibility of the footage must first be determined through the appropriate legal process.

The five accused are facing a total of 25 charges arising from three separate alleged attempted murder incidents that allegedly occurred between August 2022 and January 2024.

The charges include conspiracy to commit murder, attempted murder, unlawful possession of prohibited firearms and ammunition, money laundering, fraud, and, alternatively, defeating or attempting to defeat the administration of justice.

The matter has been postponed to 22 July 2026 for the further cross-examination of the witness and for the State to lead additional witnesses.

MORETELE MAYOR CONDEMNS THE BRUTAL KILLING OF ELDERLY SESPOND COUPLE AND CALLS FOR JUSTICE

The Mayor of Moretele Local Municipality, Hon. Councillor Masango George Manyike, has expressed profound shock, sadness and outrage following the senseless and brutal killing of an elderly couple from Sespond near Dertig in Ward 22.

The deceased have been identified as Mrs. Tsakane Sarah Rafedile (62) and Mr. Moses Saike Rafedile (76), whose lives were tragically cut short in an act of violence that has left the community reeling with grief and disbelief.

It is alleged that the incident occurred on Friday, with the couple’s bodies only being discovered on Monday after concerned neighbours noticed an unusual lack of activity at their home and requested that a welfare check be conducted.

The Mayor conveyed his deepest and heartfelt condolences to the Rafedile family, relatives, friends, neighbours and the broader Sespond community during this painful time.

*“The brutal killing of elderly members of our community is both heartbreaking and unacceptable. Our senior citizens deserve to live their lives in peace, dignity and safety. We strongly condemn this heinous act and extend our sincere condolences to the family of Mr and Mrs Rafedile. No family should have to endure such a tragedy,”*said Mayor Manyike.

The Mayor further welcomed reports that a suspect (17-year-old) has been arrested in connection with the matter and urged the criminal justice system to act decisively.

*“While no arrest can undo the pain and loss suffered by the family, we trust that the law will take its course and that justice will be served. We call on all relevant authorities to ensure that a thorough investigation is conducted and that those responsible are held fully accountable for their actions,”*he added.

Mayor Manyike also called on residents to stand together against all forms of violence and to support the grieving family during this difficult period.

The Rafedile family is expected to lay their loved ones to rest on Saturday, 27 June 2026.Moretele Local Municipality joins the community in mourning this tragic loss and prays for strength, comfort and healing for all those affected.

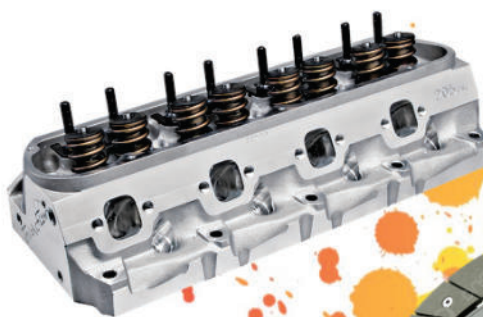
